Message from the Chairman of the Board

Covid-19 has remained with us since our last newsletter and we have conscientiously followed the Government's guidelines during the lockdown. Access to the Hospital has been restricted and the Hub closed since Christmas.

We are, however, delighted to plan the reopening of the external patio area of the Hub on 12 April and the interior on 17 May, introducing our new Chef, Paul.



The overhead wires on the Care Home site have been put underground and construction of the 60 bed Care Home is due to start in June with completion scheduled for September 2022.

Another exciting development is the potential for having an echocardiogram service for the Outpatient area of the Hospital, providing we can support the NHS by raising the £40,000 capital for the purchase. To date we have £25,000 committed, so our target to achieve through fundraising and donations is the remaining £15,000. We believe this is a very important opportunity for Rye.

In January two of our Board members, Sally Compton (Vice-Chairman) and Ben Chiswick stepped down having been very active for nearly 30 years between them! We wish Sally and Ben all the best and thank them very much for their hard work, dedication and sound advice over the years. Sally will be continuing as an elected member of our Friends Committee so she will remain a familiar face!

Three new members were welcomed to the Board – Jo Posnette, Brenda Baker and Ian Potter (whose name most of our Friends will already know as a former Mayor of Rye). Jo, Brenda and Ian bring with them a wealth of clinical, adult social care and legal experience and will be looking at ways to improve the services that both the Hospital and the Hub on Rye Hill can offer the local community.
